Carolyn Ruth Musser (Bishop), age 86 of Farwell, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, January 31, 2023 at her home surrounded by her family. Carolyn was born on July 22, 1936 to James C. and Elizabeth (Shaub) Bishop in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. She was united in marriage to Robert E. Musser on June 28, 1958 in Lancaster and together they enjoyed over sixty-four years of marriage.
