Dallas Dean Agle was born to the late Gerald (Gary) and Ellen Agle on March 31, 1956. He lived a life full of adventure before his unexpected passing on May 19, 2022. Dallas was born at Clare hospital in Michigan, setting the record for longest baby to date, measuring 23 inches long—he was the 1000th baby to be born at the hospital. Dallas attended Farwell High School and graduated in 1974. During his high school years, Dallas obtained his pilot license and loved flying his father’s Piper Cub to neighboring states, sightseeing and visiting friends. Following graduation, he served as a Paramedic in the United States Air Force, stationed in Colorado Springs after completing basic training in Texas. Upon conclusion of his service, he worked as a construction foreman with the United States Army Corps of Engineers in Anchorage, Alaska where he worked on classified projects for the US government. During his time in Alaska, he thrived in his family life and honed his hunting and fishing skills. He could tell you a new and exciting story of his numerous excursions for every day of the week. Dallas returned to his hometown of Farwell, Michigan in 1995 where he became an active member of his community. He served as city councilman, township sexton, sports official, and real estate professional. He expanded his cooking skills, and enjoyed providing chef services at private parties and events around the area. Dallas furthered his love of fishing, taking numerous trips to Canada and upstate New York, adding to his already infinite book of exciting stories. Dallas was a devoted son, loving father, doting grandfather and forever friend. He will

be unspeakably missed.

Dallas is survived by his children— Stephanie (Jared) Sansom, Matthew (Tina) Agle, Kristen (Lou) Corriero, his grandchildren—Alahna, Christian and Daniel Sansom, Evelyn Agle, and Jackson, Harrison and Kennedy Corriero, and by his loving brother Kevin (Libby) Agle.
