David L. Wixson, age 51 of Farwell, passed away unexpectedly on Saturday, September 4, 2021 at the MidMichigan Medical Center of Clare. On January 17, 1970, David was born the eldest of two children to Larry and Mary (Jankowsky) Wixson in Flint Michigan. Shortly after graduating from Montrose High School in 1988, David moved to the Farwell area and began his work career with PPG Industries of Ewart—where he worked proudly until his medical retirement in the early 2000's.
