Freddie Lee Lawson, 89, of Farwell MI (formally of Detroit MI) passed away Friday December 4th 2015 at his home around 3 A. M. after a long battle with cancer. Fred was born August 20, 1926 in Forkland, AL to Susie C. Thompson. Fred was married to Margaret Ellen Watt on June 26 1971, in Detroit MI.

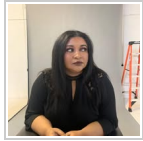
