Horace Landis Ruark "Landis the Legend", age 82 of Farwell, passed away at his home on Tuesday, September 10, 2019 with his loving family by his side. He was born in Neosho, Missouri on April 3, 1937 to David and Madge (Lay) Ruark. Landis was a graduate of Clare High School class of 1955 after which he entered the U.S. Navy until honorably discharged in 1959.
