Surrounded by family, Judy Lynn Wachowiak, 70, of Midland, passed away peacefully on Friday, September 20, 2024, at the Corewell Health Hospital of Grand Rapids, Fred & Lena Meijer Heart Center.

She was born September 7, 1954, in Mt. Pleasant, the daughter of Ronald and Myrtle Wachowiak. When Judy was in middle school, the family moved to Farwell where she later graduated. She secured a job with Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, where she was employed for 43 years as the executive secretary to the Director. She was professional, confidential, and shared her knowledge and experience with others. She was a highly valued asset to MDHHS.

It is a rare occurrence in our lives when someone comes along that touches the soul of every person they meet. Judy was one of those people. She was the epitome of a sweet, caring, loyal, kind and fun-loving person. People were drawn to her as she was always the life of the party. She had many life-long friends, and to them, it felt like a sisterhood.

The oldest of five, Judy fiercely loved her family, and they easily returned that love. She was the beloved Aunt Jude to all her nieces and nephews who cherished her deeply, especially during their one-on-one weekends with her. She made them feel loved and treasured, and she nurtured them when they needed it. One characterized her as being like a nice, warm hug.

She was loving as well as lovable; a good person to lean on in joy, despair, or grief. She was a good listener. When someone was in need, Judy was

generous with her time and jumped right in to help. Her laughter was very much a part of her.

Judy was very well known for her cooking, especially comfort food. She fed you, laughed with you, cried with you, and loved on you.

She will forever be remembered, as well, for the Christmas Bags she was famous for.

Judy faced her lung disease with bravery, resilience, and determination, a struggle that ultimately took her from us far too soon.

Survivors include the love of her life, Wayne Reinberg, sisters Debora (Gary) Klunzinger of Mt. Pleasant, Patricia (John) Mishler of Beaverton, brother, Ronald (Betty) Wachowiak of Hallettsville, TX, sister-in-law (sister by choice), Sue Wachowiak of Farwell, as well as many nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents and her brother, Douglas Wachowiak.
