“ A True Mentor and Hero

I have grown up hoping that I can be just half the person that my grandmother was. It was always amazing to me that as the eldest of 17 children with 7 children and 28 grandchildren of her own and countless nieces, nephews, great-grandchildren, etc. Grandma never lost track of anyone. She could tell you each person's birthday and was always able to send cards to each and every one of them until it was too hard for her to write. Not only did she know what was going on in each person's life, but she knew simple little quirks / habits about each person. For example, Grandma was once sharing with me identifying quirks / habits of her grandchildren. She told me that I have always had a habit of saying, "Umm" whenever I ate or drank something. I thought it was an odd quirk because I never noticed it. Later in years I married Mike Gorajewski where our wedding was videotaped. As I watched the video I noticed during our toast that the camera caught me saying, "Umm" right after I tasted the champagne. Boy was Grandma right! WOW! I grew up in California and didn't get to see Grandma and Grandpa as much; however, she identified that little quirk. Since that time I listen for my "Umm" and I think of Grandma each time.

I am sure that many of us have handmade quilts from Grandma. In her busy life she always managed to make quilts for special occasions. I keep the quilt that Grandma made for me and Mike on display in my bedroom. I still use it during the winter, but I safeguard it with my life. I always enjoy looking at her name that is embroidered on the blanket. When my son Raymond was born she made him a beautiful yellow baby quilt that my granddaughter Marilyn is enjoying today. Elizabeth was born 10 years ago and Grandma apologized for not making Elizabeth a quilt as it was getting harder for her to do. Of course I didn't mind. Instead she gave me a lap quilt that she made for Grandpa because he was always cold in his later years. The quilt is made of old polyester material that may have actually been from some of the outfits that she had during the polyester days. Talk about cherishing something...Elizabeth never had an opportunity to use that quilt because it reminds me so much of Grandpa when I would visit them. That quilt is also displayed in my bedroom and will be passed on to Elizabeth when she has her own children.

Grandma and Grandpa were all about their grandchildren; each and every one of them. As such, they opened savings accounts for each of their grandchildren when they were born. About 20 years ago Grandma gave me a 1962 pink calendar plate that the Bank gave her when she opened my savings account. Imagine, all those grandchildren and they made sure to open accounts for each and every one of them. Not many people make that priority for their grandchildren, but Grandma and Grandpa did. Yes, that plate is proudly displayed in my bedroom along with the quilts. Our parents and aunts / uncles helped Grandma with her Grandchildren Bracelet. When a Grandchild was born the parent's would purchase a child's head charm (male / female accordingly) and having it engraved with the child's name and birthdate. Grandma was so proud of

that bracelet and she wore it frequently. It was as if she had her grandchildren with her all the time. And those grandchild shirts that Aunt Sue would make for Grandma were equally prize possessions.

As a growing adult I made it a priority to visit Grandma and Grandpa almost each year. My co-workers would chide me when they heard that I was going to Michigan. "You're young, single and make decent money! You should be going to the Bahamas or some exotic place for your vacation." is what they would say. My response was, "But my grandparents live in Michigan." I was truly blessed to be able to visit Grandma and Grandpa as much as I did. The invitation to visit was always there for me. Grandma would always be waiting with a beer in one hand and a wine cooler in the other (for me of course). She always had a scrumptious home cooked meal wai

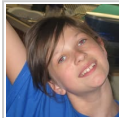
