Lot of memories. (when me & Scott were pre-schoolers in 1966 we lived around that corner on Cunningham St. next to Sandy Cunningham, our Dad worked at Worldtronic on Holley St.) & I saw Sandy wrote a comment on here too for Terry. Now I am 62 & I see Terry was 64, time flies.

We sort of looked up to Terry & his buddy Randy Parrish, they were some of the older guys we noticed who could be kind of a role model. It was a fun neighborhood there in the 70s with Crawfords, Haynaks, Robin Gray, & Randy Gillis (Mr. & Mrs. Gillis were super cool too). We played at the tar-coated old cattle loader docks behind Seiter's Lumber by the huge "canyon" near r.r. tracks.

I distinctly remember Terry being impressed with the artwork done on the Corner Store, it was a high schooler girl Terry's age named Margaret Williams who accurately painted the Frito-bandito or Lay's chips or something as a huge mural 🎨🖌️ on that store. I heard Terry always say, "she's doing a great job on that art work".

Later I remember seeing Terry at the Clare Cemetery always taking EXTREME quality care of his Dad's large tombstone. Our stepgrampa Les was the cemetery boss & when he let us work there part time, Grampa Les told us to not mow Mr. Kile's plot because "his son Terry does that with his own equipment". It was done like an actual landscaper did it. It's very near our own brother

Mark's grave now. ✨ ✨

When I moved to Wisconsin & got married, I never saw Terry again 🇺🇸 but I like to honor his memory, a neat fella, thanks --Frederick Woods 🎸 🎹
